Hazard Statement:

4. First-Aid Measures

General advice:

First aid personnel should pay attention to their own safety. If the patient is likely to become unconscious, place and transport in stable sideways position (recovery position). Immediately remove contaminated clothing.

If inhaled:

Keep patient calm, remove to fresh air, seek medical attention.

Call a poison control center or physician for treatment advice.

On skin contact:

Immediately wash thoroughly with soap and water, seek medical attention.

Call a poison control center or physician for treatment advice.

On contact with eyes:

Wash affected eyes for at least 15 minutes under running water with eyelids held open, consult an eye specialist.

On ingestion:

Immediately rinse mouth and then drink 200-300 ml of water, seek medical attention.

If swallowed, seek medical advice immediately and show this container or label. Do not induce vomiting unless told to by a poison control center or doctor. Call a poison control center or physician for treatment advice. Take patient to hospital immediately. Medical monitoring for at least 7 days.

Note to physician:

Symptoms: The most important known symptoms and effects are described in the labelling (see section 2) and/or in section 11., Further important symptoms and effects are so far not known.

Symptoms of poisoning may only appear after several hours or several days.

Treatment: Treat according to symptoms (decontamination, vital functions), no known specific antidote.

5. Fire-Fighting Measures

Suitable extinguishing media:

6. Accidental Release Measures

Personal precautions:

Methods for cleaning up or taking up:

For large amounts: Dike spillage. Pump off product.

Collect waste in suitable containers, which can be labeled and sealed. Clean contaminated floors and objects thoroughly with water and detergents, observing environmental regulations. Incinerate or take to a special waste disposal site in accordance with local authority regulations. Dispose of absorbed material in accordance with regulations. Wear suitable protective equipment.

Handling

Ensure thorough ventilation of stores and work areas. No special measures necessary if stored and handled correctly. When using do not eat, drink or smoke. Hands and/or face should be washed before breaks and at the end of the shift. Remove contaminated clothing and protective equipment before entering eating areas.

No special precautions necessary. The substance/product is non-combustible. Product is not explosive.
